Boston College's Annie Haeger and Emily Massa Named NEISA Women's Sailor of the Week

NEW LONDON, CT - 11/1/10 - Annie Haeger '12 and (*BYC's*) Emily Massa '12 have been named NEISA's Women's Sailor of the Week, after winning A division at the Victorian Coffee Urn. The Boston College juniors dominated the regatta, winning a string of five races in a row during the twelve race series.

Annie and Emily finished outside the top five only once, resulting in a nineteen point margin of victory. The divisional win also helped the Eagles secure the overall, qualifying the team for the Women's Atlantic Coast Championship hosted by Eckerd College. Qualifying in addition to BC are Connecticut College, Harvard University, Coast Guard Academy, Yale University, Tufts University, and Dartmouth College.

Winter Storage

A reminder to boat owners that wet winter storage is available in the South Marina this upcoming season. See the 2010 fee schedule for pricing or call club management.

Marina Operations

The club launch will be running daily from 0800 hours to Sunset through the end of the season. When calling on the radio (CH68) repeat "Nor'easter" at least twice to get our attention, if we do not answer quickly, please be patient and call again.

Current Fuel Prices: \$3.35/gallon 89 Octane & \$3.20/gallon Marine Diesel

Both Launch service and fueling operations will cease on November 14th. Water service to the marina basin will be discontinued on November 8th.

Winter Bar Hours

Even as the weather changes, the bar will be open during all "Club Nights" and scheduled events, such as Frostbiting. Please come down to the Club to enjoy a beverage among friends.

Hazardous Material Disposal

As we clean out our boats for the season, please be sure to dispose of hazardous and polluting material safely and properly. Used gas, oil, etc. should not be left in Club trash but should be disposed of in proscribed fashion. Follow your town's hazardous material collection schedule (or neighboring towns with reciprocal privileges) or contact your local DEP regarding disposal.

Dry Storage

All sailing dinghies (Sunfish, Laser, 420, etc) stored on BYC property on either the racks or dollies must be labeled with appropriate 2010 "Winter" green sticker and registered with club management. Storage applications are available online, under "Club Services" and then "Office Information" or can be obtained during normal business hours in the lobby.

It is requested that boats stored for the summer be removed by November 1st.

Ethanol & Winter Storage Tip

Ethanol in fuel increases the breakdown rate of fuel quality. As it separates over time the ethanol has corrosive qualities and develops an affinity for water. In the winter if you store your engine with fuel you increase the likelihood of problems in the spring. The fuel system can become compromised which will cause damaged components. It is recommended that you drain all fuel from the engine and boat and start fresh in the new season.
