## **BARRINGTON YACHT CLUB CREW WINS CLASS B HONORS FOR THE 2011 MARION TO BERMUDA CRUISING YACHT RACE**

Bob Anderson's Alden 44 ARIEL with Seven BYC sailors, including Commodore Scott Walker, finished the 645 mile ocean race course in a corrected time of slightly over 94 hours. Crewmembers Charlie McCoy, Bob Malcolm, Joel Berendes, Gene Healey and Dick Waterman, all veterans of several previous Bermuda Races, rounded out the crew. Departing Buzzards Bay shortly after noon on June 17th, with Joel on the helm and in a choppy sea with 35 knot headwinds, they struggled out around Cuttyhunk Island, and off to the south, crossing the turbulent currents of the Gulf Stream and then on to a finish line within the coral reefs that surround Bermuda.



This was the 31st M-B event, and the 6th for Ariel and most of her crew. Each boat carried a position transponder that linked to a graphics-based website that allowed friends and family to track the boat's progress throughout the race. Followers back home could monitor boat speed and position for each of the 50 boats in the Race, to get a sense of the wind and weather conditions faced by each boat in its current position. Ariel maintain a placement of second through sixth for most of the race, and at about the halfway distance, was nearly 60 miles behind the lead boat, another 44 footer from the US Naval Academy with a crew of student Midshipmen learning celestial navigation and offshore sailing skills during their summer break.

The last few days provided consistent heavy winds of often 30-40 kts, excellent ocean conditions for the heavier boats in the fleet, and in particular ARIEL. On corrected time, ARIEL placed slightly ahead of both USNA sailboats to win the First-In-Class honors. After spending 4 days at the Royal Hamilton Amateur Dinghy Club, the Bermuda Host for the event, and after the 'Prize Giving' Ceremony where the Governor of Bermuda presented the awards, Ariel will return to Barrington.
