Hello everyone! June is here and STP is ready to get going. During the summer, please remember to read the weekly email blast for STP updates and reminders. Here are a few things to keep in mind as the 2012 season gets underway:

### IMPORTANT DATES:

- June 11 @ 6:30 STP Committee Meeting
- June 11 @ 7:30 Opti Race Team Night
- June 21 @ 5:45 STP Opening (meet the program chair and staff; learn about program; ask questions)

### MORE IMPORTANT DATES:

- June 18 STP Instructor Training begins
- June 25 STP Session 1 begins
- June 27 First night of Mugwumps (Racing-lite for kids: the more, the merrier!!!)

### CLASS AVAILABILITY:

Yes, we have openings in many of our classes, especially in Session 3 and Session 4.

### STP SWIM CHECK:

All first-time participants in BYC STP must pass the BYC Swim Check in order to participate in any STP activity. Families must make arrangements for children to take the swim check prior to participation. Students who arrive on the first day of STP without having successfully completed the swim check will not be allowed to participate and parents will be notified. No refunds will be given for class time missed as a result of failure to complete the swim check. Returning students who have completed the swim check and participated in STP during a previous year do not have to retake the swim check. Please contact the office to find out when the Pool Staff will be conducting STP Swim Checks.

## **MANAGER'S CORNER**

### **LAUNCH**

The transportation of fuel, propane and open alcoholic beverages on club launches is prohibited by the USCG.

### **USE OF UTILITIES**

Available utilities (i.e. water and power) are limited and may be inadequate at some dock slips for vessels requiring more than 30 amps power. Each pedestal in the marina basin can handle a total draw of 30amps. If both sides of a pedestal are being used, the total draw from both cannot exceed the 30 amps or the circuit will trip. Therefore, members must exercise prudent use of on-board items that require electrical power. Do not leave equipment, such as air conditioning, operating when the vessel is not occupied. It is recognized and permitted that some constant use of electricity is required to operate on board equipments such as refrigerators, chargers, and bilge pumps.

### **RESTROOMS/SHOWERS**

Starting in June, the Dana Rice facilities will be open 24hr for members and their guests along with transient boaters registered at the club. The club will ensure restrooms are cleaned daily, however, members are asked to clean up after themselves for the next member. Any problems with equipment should be reported to staff as soon as possible.

### **GARBAGE**

All garbage shall be disposed in dumpsters or collection containers located throughout the club grounds or removed from the club premises. Please do not leave trash bags, etc. on docks or on ground areas by trashcans. Containers are not to be used for disposal of hazardous materials.

### **DISPOSAL OF SANITARY (SEWAGE) WASTE**

Many of our boating members have built-in heads (toilets) with holding/disposal sanitary waste systems on their vessels. Federal and state law require proper disposal of waste. Club policy and law requires no discharge of sanitary

waste within the marina basin or Barrington River. Member boaters may use the club provided waste pump-out station located at the club fuel dock to pump out on board waste holding systems tanks.

### **ON-BOARD BBQ OR OPEN FIRE COOKING**

Open flame cooking (charcoal or gas) is not permitted on vessels within the marina basin. We have two designated locations where grilling can be done safely; the main grills located at the front of the club house and a second grill area with picnic tables located down toward the southern point. Please see a steward for grill supplies.

### **ONSITE STORAGE**

Boat and/or trailer storage is not permitted on the BYC property. Dry storage racks are available for Kayaks, Sunfish and Lasers.

### **PETS**

Pets shall remain on a leash or in owner's control at all times. Members must not let their pets roam freely in the club area and are required to pick up after their pets. Pets are not permitted in the clubhouse. Pets will be allowed to be with their owners on the deck area providing the area is not being utilized for club function and the owner must keep control of pet at all times.

### **HAZARDOUS MATERIAL**

Products such as pesticides, oil, paint, batteries, and petroleum products are hazardous materials that become known as "hazardous wastes" upon disposal. Hazardous wastes are subject to strict regulation by federal, state, and local agencies. The club does not have hazardous material waste disposal, therefore, the burden of proper disposal becomes the member. **UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES WILL OIL, FUEL, FUEL/OIL FILTERS, OR OTHER CONTAMINATES BE PLACED IN GARBAGE CANS, CONTAINERS, DUMPSTERS, OR LEFT IN/AT ANY OTHER PLACE ON THE CLUB PREMISES.**

### SAILING DINGHY STORAGE POLICY

1. All sailing dinghies (Sunfish, Laser, 420, Kayaks, etc) stored on BYC property on either the racks or dollies must be labeled with appropriate 2012 BYC sticker and registered with club management.
2. Summer storage applications are available online, under "Club Services & Hours" and then "Office Information" or can be obtained from Club Management during normal business hours.
3. Fees are listed on the fee schedule earlier in the Log.
4. Storage on dollies is only available in the designated space east of the storage container north of the northeast corner of the parking lot.
5. May 1st is the deadline to start removing all dinghies stored over the winter at BYC.
6. Sailing Dinghies not removed by June 1st, will be considered abandoned property and may be removed from the club premise.
