BYC Recycling

There have been some questions as to whether the Barrington Yacht Club has a recycling program in place. BYC management has chosen to utilize the services of R.J. Souto Disposal Service, a Massachusetts vendor that picks up and delivers all our solid waste to ABC Disposal who owns a transfer station. ABC Disposal then sells it to SEMASS Resource Recovery Facility located in Rochester, which is owned by Energy Answers Corporation. This facility is one of the first large-scale US waste-to-energy facilities that utilize modern resource recovery technology. This is the separation of reusable resources from the waste stream coupled with combustion of the residual waste for the purpose of clean energy generation. In short, converts solid waste into electric energy. The technology used substantially reduces incoming waste by 90% volume and toxicity by 95%. It also recovers recyclable metals and produces ash, which is used in the construction materials of roadways and concrete blocks. The facility not only produces renewable electricity to more than 75,000 homes in the Cape Cod region, but is so environmentally friendly that it is surrounded by 1200 acres of cranberry bogs, which is a vital component of the local economy.

This process takes the burden of recycling off of the individual members and the Club staff but at the same time allows us to be good stewards of our surrounding environment.

Protection and conservation of the environment are just a few of the many issues that we face today. Barrington Yacht Club has demonstrated that you can be a good environment steward, while at the same time, being fiscally responsible to your membership by researching and pursuing a cost effective recycling program.
