Barrington Yacht Club invites you to participate in the
2020 Get on the Water BYC Family Race
for cruising class boats.

- This is an “around the island” pursuit race with starts staggered, according to PHRF rating.
- Crews consisting of family are strongly encouraged and Skippers should follow the Phase 2 DEM guidelines for safe sailing.

NOTICE OF RACE

1) Rules

- a) The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- b) This is a non-spinnaker race,
 - i) Only a single headsail, fully hanked to the headstay, is allowed, except during the rapid change of headsails.
 - ii) Spinnakers, bloopers, etc. are prohibited
- c) The US Sailing Prescription Appendix V shall apply.

2) Regatta Website

- a) No Website for this race.

3) Entry

- a) NO Online entry.
- b) Completed entries should be received by 1700 on Friday June 5th.
- c) Register by email at racing@barringtonyc.com
- d) Include: Boat name, Skipper and crew, sail number, and PHRF rating.

4) Fees

- a) The entry fees is:
 - i) No Fee

5) Schedule

- a) Warning Signal for all starts 1155
- b) Prep Signal 1156
- c) First Start 1200
- d) Subsequent starts 1 minute intervals
- e) Starting time for each boat is as designated in the time schedule for PHRF ratings. To be posted as Appendix A to the Sailing Instructions.

6) Sailing Instructions

- a) Sailing Instructions will be available via email and at the Barrington Yacht Club.

7) Start/Finish

- a) The start/finish shall be at Ohio Ledge.

8) Course

- a) The course is around Prudence Island.
- b) The direction of rounding shall be clockwise.
- c) The following marks are to be left to starboard, ie, between the island and the competitor:
 - i) C27 Sandy Point
 - ii) R/G south end of the island
 - iii) R8 west of Northwest Point
 - iv) R/G Providence Point

9) Penalty System

- a) The Penalty system in RRS 44 as modified by RRS V1 shall apply.

10) Scoring

- a) Each boat shall be scored in the position she finishes.

11) Electronic Communication

- a) Each boat shall carry a radio capable of transmitting and receiving VHF channels 13, 16 and 72, the race channel.
- b) Except in an emergency or to report a protest or withdrawal, a boat that is racing shall not make or receive voice or data communications that is not freely available to all boats.
- c) All competitors are expected to maintain an active listening watch on the race channel (VHF 72).

12) Prizes

- a) No Awards.
